
# **Technique Revision**


I hope you're taking care to play with the correct technique and not falling into bad habits. The following pictures show you the best way to hold your hands as well as some common mistakes to avoid.

#### **Hand Positions**

#### **Left Hand**



The knuckles should be held parallel to the fingerboard. Any fingers not being used should hover just above the strings.




Sleepy finger Do not let the index finger fall asleep on the fingerboard. It has to stand to attention!

Fly-away fingers Oh no! This is terrible! The fingers are all twisted and flying away from the fingerboard!

#### **Left-Hand Thumb**









Bad!




This is the correct position for the thumb - the thumb should be bent backwards.

A thumb that is 'grabby', 'pointy', or 'collapsed' will restrict the movement and control of your fingers; using a footstool helps encourage correct thumb placement.

#### **Right Hand**



- relaxed hand
- wrist slightly arched
- high knuckles
- big hole in the hand
- thumb held away from the hand





Bad!


Scratchy hand

Great for scratching someone, but not suitable for playing the guitar!

- tense hand
- low wrist
- flat knuckles
- collapsed hand
- thumb inside the hand

### **Posture**

The classical guitarist's sitting position is recommended because it gives the player more technical control.
