

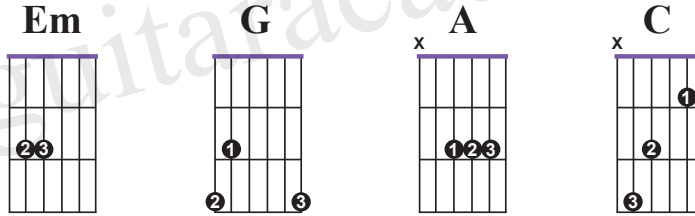


Rock School!

This piece will give you plenty of opportunity to rock out, with parts included for rhythm, bass, and lead guitar – just add drums and you can start your own band!

Rhythm Guitar

This chord sequence is repeated throughout.



This cool chord sequence can be found in many rock/pop songs, e.g. *Steppin' Stone* by The Monkees.

Bass Guitar

The bass part is shown below in **guitar tablature** (or 'tab.') as well as normal notation. Rock music is often written in tab., which is a shorthand alternative to normal music notation. The rules of tab. are very simple:

- 1) Tablature uses six lines, one for each guitar string.
- 2) The numbers written on the string lines show the fret positions: 1 = 1st fret, 2 = 2nd fret, etc., 0 = open string.

These are the same notes in normal notation

Lead Guitar

Improvise solos using this scale. Add the optional A[#] (shown in parenthesis) to transform the Em pentatonic scale into the E blues scale.

Riffin' Guitar

Strum through both strings
