The time signature of $3+3+2$ is quite unusual. Such time signatures are called **additive** and show the grouping of the stresses, i.e. $\dot{1} \ 2 \ 3, \dot{1} \ 2 \ 3, \dot{1} \ 2$. This is a **rumba** rhythm (originally from Cuba), which is a feature of a style of Spanish flamenco music known as **Flamenco Rumba**.
